On behalf of the North Carolina Department of Transportation, Dovetail Cultural Resource Group (Dovetail) conducted archaeological excavations of the Trogdon-Squirrel Creek site (31RD1426). Excavations focused on an early-nineteenth- to early-twentieth-century Quaker farmstead. This investigation resulted in the recovery of over 20,000 artifacts and revealed a dwelling with stone piers, an associated outbuilding, and cultural landscape features.
