Museum of History Summer Camp 2019

- **Registration:** begins February 15 for MOHA/museum members; opens March 1 for general public
- **Need-based scholarships:** Applications can be downloaded from the museum website.
- **Enrollment:** Limited to 14 participants per camp for K–2; capped at 16 participants per camp for 3–5, 6–8, and 8–10
- **Fees:** \$90+tax per camp for members; \$100+tax per camp for general public
- **Lunchtime care:** available noon–1 p.m. for \$15 per week; bring your own bag lunch!

Completed grades K–2 Pirates, Ships, and Lighthouses

June 24–28, 8:30 a.m.–noon

Set sail for adventure! You'll learn about fierce pirates like Blackbeard and Anne Bonny, build a lighthouse, wear pirate's clothing, taste sea rations, and hear sea-faring stories.

Moccasins to Rocket Ships

June 24–28, 1–4:30 p.m.

Explore how transportation has changed in North Carolina over the years. You'll make mocs, float a boat, signal a train, race cars—and blast off a rocket.

Completed grades 3–5 On the Homefront

August 5–9, 8:30 a.m.–noon

What was life like during World War II times? You'll listen to swing music; taste Victory cooking; find out what soldiers wore, ate, and carried; write a V-mail letter; and shop with ration cards and red points.

American Indians Past and Present

August 5–9, 1–4:30 p.m.

Did you know that more American Indians live in North Carolina than in any other state east of the Mississippi River? Find out about past and present tribes, make a coil pot, design your own beadwork pattern, and listen to stories from our state's first people.

The '20s and '30s: Between the Wars

July 8–12, 9:30 a.m.–4:30 p.m.

Explore life in North Carolina from the "war to end all wars" through the Roaring Twenties to the Hard Luck Thirties and another world war. The politics, the music, the culture of these times produced what some call "the greatest generation."

History Training Shop

July 29–August 2, 9:30 a.m.–4:30 p.m.

Go behind the scenes to discover how a museum operates. You'll learn to present a hands-on gallery cart to the public and to create fun, educational guides for visitors—and you'll visit neighboring historic sites for special tours! By the end of this week, campers will be invited to join the museum's advanced docent training course and become official volunteers.
