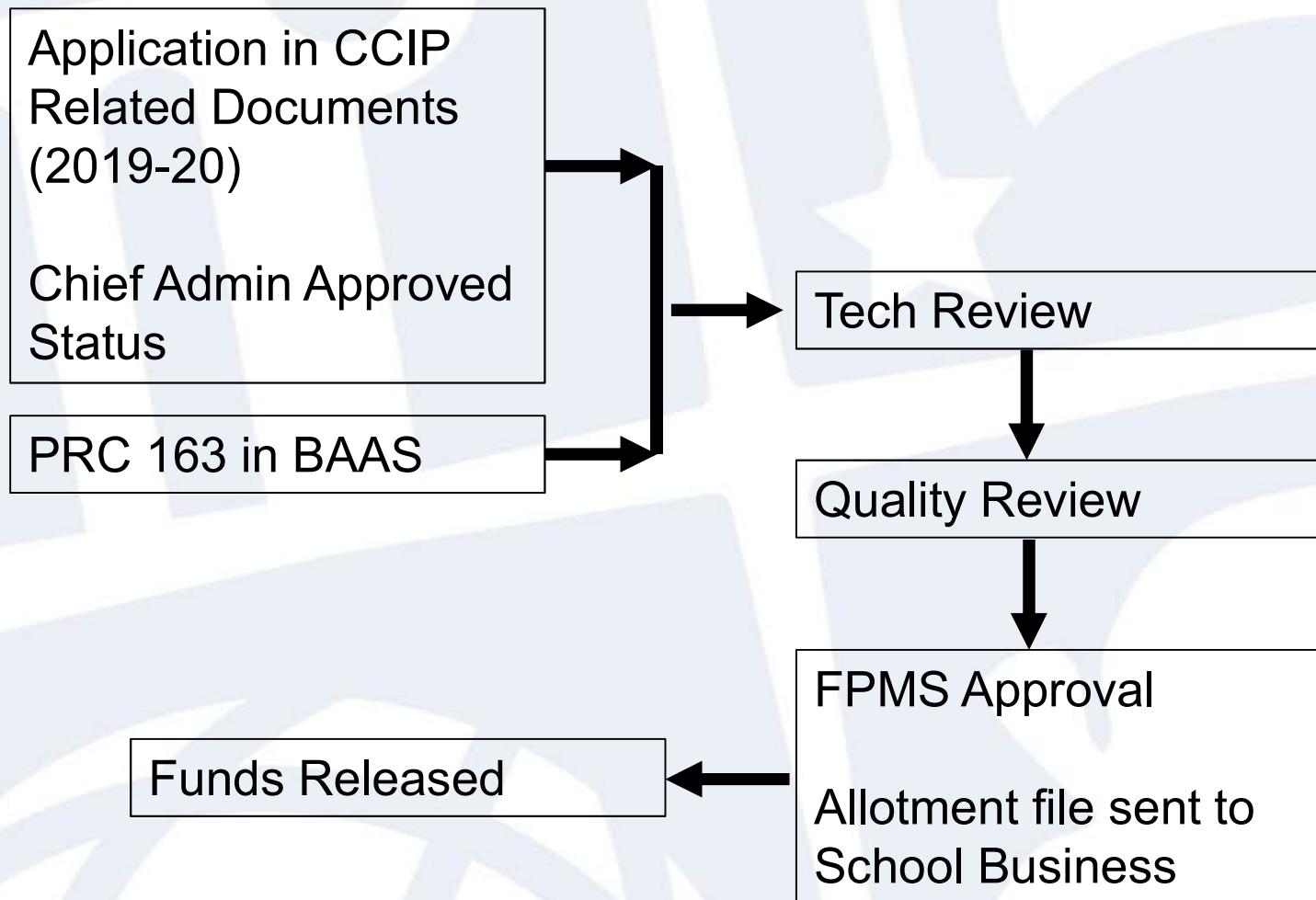


Application Basics

- **Equitable Share in Site Code 860, cost allocated**
- **Recommended submission by June 1**
- **Completed private school consultations by August 30, 2020**

- 75% of students have sufficient internet access while not at school

PART B: Data Analysis

Based on the data above, Berryville County Schools has determined the following:

- Insufficient supplies exist to properly sanitize schools
- Schools do not have enough PPE to protect students and staff
- Training is necessary for all employees on hygiene and sanitation protocols prior to reopening
- 5th to 6th grade transition in all schools will not be the same because of the lack of devices
- All schools need devices to bring BCS to 1:1 districtwide to allow for online instruction to take place
- Training for BCS middle and high school teachers needs to occur to facilitate online instruction
- BCS will need to purchase an LMS to support online instruction
- Mobile hotspots are needed to provide students with internet access
- All schools need upgraded wireless to allow blended instruction to continue upon reopening

Part D: Strategy Implementation

Brief description of how each strategy will be implemented:

- 1-All BCS Staff will be trained in the BCS Sanitation and Hygiene protocol (SHP)
- 2-All BCS buildings will be sanitized using the process outlined in the SHP by June 30, 2020
- 3-Supplies required to effectively sanitize will be purchased

Timeline for implementation:

- 1-by August 1, 2020
- 2-by July 31, 2020
- 3-by June 30, 2020

Plan to measure impact:

- 1: Monitoring percentage of staff trained on a weekly basis; required for reentry
- 2 and 3: staff responsible for executing SHP will complete checklist once completed; site manager will submit to Chief of Staff

Although some uses of funds will overlap, in this example there is no plan, timeline, or measure of impact for planning for online learning nor purchasing educational technology and would result in the application not passing quality review.
