




Pelicans spend a lot of time in the estuary looking for fish to eat.




Hermit Crabs must find empty shells for their homes.




Flounder are flat fish that live and hide in the Estuary.




Sea Stars are never found in fresh water.




Stingrays flap their fins to “fly” through the water of the estuary.




Some Jellyfish are clear but others are yellow, blue, pink or purple.




Empty shells left from oysters, scallops, clams and other animals are fun to pick up and collect.




This crab hides in the grass of the estuary for protection. Can you help him get back to his home?



Connect the dots. What kind of bird do you see?




What do you think these clams are saying about estuaries?
