The N.C. Division of Waste Management (division) has received the selected remedy to address groundwater contamination at the Construction and Demolition (C&D) Landfill (Phase 1 and Phase 2), located at 802 Recycling Lane in Greenville (Pitt County). EJE Recycling & Disposal, Inc. / C&D Landfill, Inc. submitted the *North Carolina Solid Waste .0545 Groundwater Corrective Action Permit Modification Application* dated December 2019 on Dec. 6, 2019 (FID 1378617).

The division is responsible for evaluating and approving selected remedies. The proposed selected remedy includes monitored natural attenuation and landfill capping to address groundwater contamination at the landfill.

The division is seeking public comment on the proposed selected remedy. The comment period begins Jan. 15, 2020 and ends March 2, 2020. During the comment period, any interested person may submit comments on the selected remedy or request a public hearing. All comments shall be submitted in writing. Also, a request for a public hearing should be in writing and should state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. All comments and questions should be directed to:
