Construction Stormwater

The NPDES Construction Stormwater Program regulates construction activities that disturb more than one acre under a general permit (NCG010000 or NCG250000, a.k.a. NCG01 or NCG25). Permittees are required to develop and implement an Erosion and Sedimentation Control (E&SC) Plan, adhere to materials handling protocols, inspect their sites and maintain records. The review and approval of E&SC Plans is done by the [DEMLR Sediment Program](#) and local governments that have achieved delegation of this program from DEMLR.

NCG01 Annual Permit Fees

The \$100 annual permit fee for the NPDES NCG01 Permit began on August 1, 2019. The process for receiving a Certificates of Coverage is:

- The applicant submits the eNOI without payment (just like before).
- DEMLR staff reviews the eNOI within three business days of submittal.
- If the eNOI is determined to be complete, the applicant receives an email with instructions for each of three payment options (credit card, e-check and paper check).
- The applicant makes the payment using one of the payment options.

TO DISCHARGE STORMWATER UNDER THE
NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM

for establishments primarily engaged in the following activities:

Vehicle Maintenance Areas

In compliance with the provisions of North Carolina General Statute 143-215.1, other lawful standards and regulations promulgated and adopted by the North Carolina Environmental Management Commission and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, this permit is hereby issued to all owners or operators, hereinafter permittees, which are covered by this permit as evidenced by receipt of a Certificate of Coverage by the Environmental Management Commission to allow the **discharge of stormwater to the surface waters of North Carolina** or to a separate storm sewer system conveying discharges to surface waters in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein.

Coverage under this General Permit is applicable to:

- All owners or operators of stormwater point source discharges associated with establishments primarily engaged in activities classified as **Vehicle Maintenance Areas** (including vehicle rehabilitation, mechanical repairs, painting, fueling, lubrication and equipment cleaning operation areas) associated with activities classified as **Rail Transportation** [Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) 40], **Local and Suburban Transit and Interurban Highway Passenger Transportation** [SIC 41], **Motor Freight Transportation and Warehousing** [SIC 42], **Postal Service** [SIC 43], and **Petroleum Bulk Stations and Terminals** [SIC 5171] with total petroleum storage capacity of less than 1 million gallons.;
- Stormwater point source discharges from like industrial activities deemed by The Division of Energy, Mineral, and Land Resources (DEMLR) to be similar to these operations in the process, or the discharges, or the exposure of raw materials, intermediate products, by-products, products, or waste products. Other activities may include stormwater discharges from oil water separators, secondary containments structures at petroleum storage facilities, and/or vehicle maintenance areas at any facilities other than those listed.

The following activities and associated discharges are excluded from coverage under this General Permit:

- Maintenance areas classified as Water Transportation [SIC 44],
- Maintenance areas classified as Transportation by Air [SIC 45],
- Wash water from steam cleaning operations or other equipment cleaning operations
- Wastewater discharges from oil water separators, and
- Public Warehousing and Storage [SIC 4221-4225].

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What is “Point Source Discharge”?

21. Point Source Discharge of Stormwater

Any discernible, confined and discrete conveyance including, but not specifically limited to, any pipe, ditch, channel, tunnel, conduit, well, or discrete fissure from which stormwater associated with industrial activity is or may be discharged to waters of the state.



SECTION C: DISCHARGE LIMITATIONS AND ANALYTICAL MONITORING REQUIREMENTS - OIL WATER SEPARATORS, PETROLEUM BULK STATIONS AND TERMINALS

During the term of the permit, the permittee is authorized to discharge *stormwater* from **oil water separators** and/or **petroleum bulk stations** and **terminals secondary containment areas** subject to the provisions of this permit. If such activities have been designated by the Division, discharges shall be monitored and limited as specified in **Table 1** and sampled in accordance with the schedule presented in **Table 2**.

Note: This permit only applies to *stormwater discharges* out of *oil water separators*, and/or *petroleum bulk stations* and *terminals secondary containment areas* subject to the provisions of this permit. Wastewater discharges from these devices are a violation of the terms of the permit.

National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System application for coverage under General Permit NCG080000:

STORMWATER DISCHARGES from Vehicle Maintenance Areas (including vehicle rehabilitation, mechanical repairs, painting, fueling, lubrication, and equipment cleaning operations areas) associated with activities classified as:

- SIC 40 (Standard Industrial Classification)** Railroad Transportation
- SIC 41** Local and Suburban Transit and Interurban Highway Passenger Transportation
- SIC 42** Motor Freight Transportation and Warehousing (**except SIC 4221-4225**)
- SIC 43** United States Postal Service

The following activities are also included:

- Other industrial activities where the vehicle maintenance area(s) is the only area requiring permitting
- Petroleum Bulk Stations and Terminals (**SIC 5171**) with total petroleum site storage capacity of less than 1 million gallons
- Stormwater discharges from oil water separators and/or from secondary containment structures associated with petroleum storage facilities with less than 1 million gallons of total petroleum site storage capacity.
- Discharges associated with vehicle maintenance operations at activities, which are otherwise designated on a case-by-case basis for permitting.

Public Works Facilities



If you are at a Public Works facility that conducts vehicle maintenance:

- Investigate where the stormwater goes. (Yard Drains, Ditches, Swales, Trench Drains)
- Investigate where those conveyances end up.
- Investigate the nature of any Oil/Water separators on site. They may discharge.
- Check your distance to surface waters.
- When in doubt, contact your DEQ Regional Office and ask for an inspection.



Public Works Facilities



If your facility does require an NPDES General Permit:

- Submit a Notice of Intent (NOI) to the Central Office. (Better than responding to an NOV)
- Get to know the General Permit while waiting for your NOI to get processed.
- Begin developing your SWPPP.




