## Petroleum-Contaminated Soil Remediation Permit (Non-Discharge)

**What Activities Require This Permit?** Construction and operation of a contaminated soil treatment system.

**What Is The Purpose of This Permit?** To treat petroleum-contaminated soil in order to protect North Carolina's environment and the health of the citizens of North Carolina.

**Who Issues This Permit?** N.C. Division of Waste Management, Underground Storage Tank (UST) Section Regional Offices.

**How Much Will This Permit Cost?** Fees for Petroleum-Contaminated Soil Remediation permits are as follows:

Facility Category	Fee
Petroleum Contaminated Soil Remediation	\$480
Certificate of Approval	None

**What Are My Payment Options for Permit Application Fees?** Check

**If Paying by Check, Who do I Make the Check Payable to and Where Do I Send the Check?**

Make check payable to **DEQ-UST** and send *THE COMPLETED APPLICATION PACKAGE, INCLUDING ALL SUPPORTING INFORMATION AND MATERIALS*, to the [UST Section Regional Office appropriate for your location](#).

**How Long Will It Take To Review My Application?** The division director must issue or deny the permit within 90 days of receipt of a complete application.

**How Long Is My Permit or License or Certificate Valid?** Petroleum-Contaminated Soil Remediation permits are typically issued with a term of five years.

**Notes/Comments:** In regard to application submittal, the application fee, appropriate number of copies and required notifications must be addressed before an application can be considered complete.
