Interbasin Transfer Certification

What Activities Require This Permit? This is a certification, rather than a permit. The transfer of more than 2 million gallons per day of surface water from one river basin to another.

What Is The Purpose of This Permit? To regulate large surface water transfers between river basins by requiring a certificate from the Environmental Management Commission (EMC).

Who Issues This Permit? The Environmental Management Commission.

How Much Will This Permit Cost?

There is no application fee for an interbasin transfer (IBT) certificate. However, the certification process requires the development of an environmental document to study the impacts of the transfer and an extensive public notification process. The law specifies that the costs associated with the preparation of this document are to be paid by the applicant. In the past, these costs have ranged from \$250,000 to \$1 million.

What Are My Payment Options for Permit Application Fees? Not applicable.

If Paying by Check, Who do I Make the Check Payable to and Where Do I Send the Check? Not applicable.

How Long Will It Take To Review My Application? There is no certain amount of time required. However, in the past, the certification process has taken from two to five years to complete.

Where Do I Submit My Application? N.C. Division of Water Resources, 1611 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, NC 27699-1611.

How Long Is My Permit or License or Certificate Valid? No expiration is specified by law. However, the EMC may impose a limit for which the certificate is valid if it finds a limit is necessary.

Notes/Comments: This is a certification, rather than a permit.
