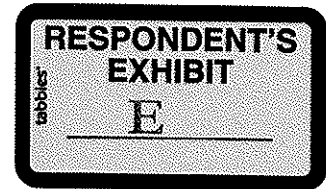


NOTICE OF HEARING



Notice is hereby given that the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development, pursuant to the authority vested in it by N.C.G.S. 143-215.1 proposes to amend Title 15, subchapter 2L of the North Carolina Administrative Code, entitled Classifications and Standards Applicable to the Underground Waters of the State of North Carolina, to be effective July 1, 1984.

The amendments:

- (1) Make clarifying changes in the introduction (15 NCAC 2L.0101).
- (2) Add certain new terms to the definitions (15 NCAC 2L.0102).
- (3) Establish the distances from the pollution source at which groundwater samples will be drawn for the purpose of determining a fineable violation of groundwater quality standards. These are:
 - a. The lesser of 500 feet or the property boundaries for existing facilities;
 - b. The lesser of 250 feet or 50 feet within the property boundaries for new facilities (15 NCAC 2L.0103).
- (4) Rewrite the provisions for compliance schedules (15 NCAC 2L.0103).
- (5) Exempt certain activities from compliance with groundwater standards (15 NCAC 2L.0103).
- (6) Rewrite the criteria for an RS designation (15 NCAC 2L.0103).
- (7) Make technical corrections to the description of the GB and GSB Classifications (15 NCAC 2L.0201).

Notice is also given that any person interested in these rules may present written or oral comments relevant to the action proposed at a public rule-making hearing to be held at 6:00 pm on the day of 13 March 1984, at


