This is to notify the public of the issuance by the North Carolina Division of Waste Management's Hazardous Waste Section of a draft renewal permit and proposed final remedy for Safety-Kleen St. Pauls located at 934 N. 5<sup>th</sup> St. in St. Pauls, North Carolina.

A public hearing will be held at 12:00 PM (noon) on Tuesday, September 17, 2019, at St. Pauls Town Hall, town council chambers, 210 West Blue Street, St. Pauls, North Carolina. All attendees will have the opportunity to present five (5) minute oral statements regarding the draft renewal permit and proposed final remedy and/or to submit written comments and data.

In conjunction with the Notice of Public Hearing for the draft renewal permit and proposed final remedy, written comments can also be sent during the public comment period of Monday, August 19, 2019 until Thursday, October 3, 2019 to the following address:

A summary of the draft renewal permit and proposed final remedy are as follows: Safety-Kleen Systems, Incorporated currently operates a hazardous waste storage facility in St. Pauls, Robeson County, North Carolina (Latitude 34.821°, Longitude -78.976°). The facility performs collection, replacement, accumulation and storage of spent mineral spirits, immersion cleaner, paint waste, and dry-cleaning wastes as a service to industrial maintenance, automotive repair and dry-cleaning businesses. RCRA-permitted areas to be covered under the renewal permit include a non-ignitable container storage area; a flammable waste storage area; one, 15,000-gallon aboveground storage tank; and, two dumpster/drum washer units located in the Return & Fill Station. The draft renewal permit also documents the proposed final remedy selected for the site, which focuses on reducing the remaining contaminants of concern in soil and groundwater using chemical injection, post-injection soil sampling and semiannual groundwater monitoring.

All comments received during the public comment period or at the hearing will be considered when making the final decision regarding this renewal permit and final remedy. Comments received after the public comment period ends will not be considered. The statutory authority for calling the permit hearing is G.S. 130A-294(f). Applicable State rules are found in the North Carolina Hazardous Waste Management Rules 15A NCAC 13A .0105, .0109, and .0113. These rules adopt the requirements of the Federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act as amended by the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984.
