Funding Actions Taken at Feb. 12, 2020 Meeting of the State Water Infrastructure Authority on Applications Submitted in September 2019 to the Division of Water Infrastructure

On September 30, 2019, the Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) received applications for funding for the federal Community Development Block Grant-Infrastructure (CDBG-I) grant program, federal Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) program, federal Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) program, and the State Reserve program. Table 1 shows the amount of funding considered in applications that were complete and eligible, and the approximate amount of funding available by source.

The State Water Infrastructure Authority (Authority) determined the eligibility of applications selected to receive funding from the available funding sources listed above. The approved funding provides the best funding available for a given project application and maximizes the utilization of the current funding resources.
