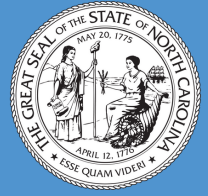


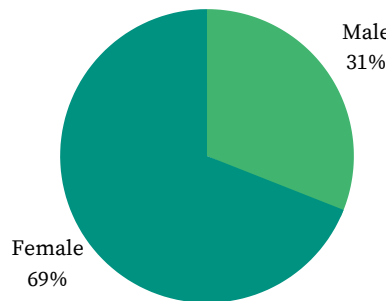
State of North Carolina Internship Program 2021 Internship Class



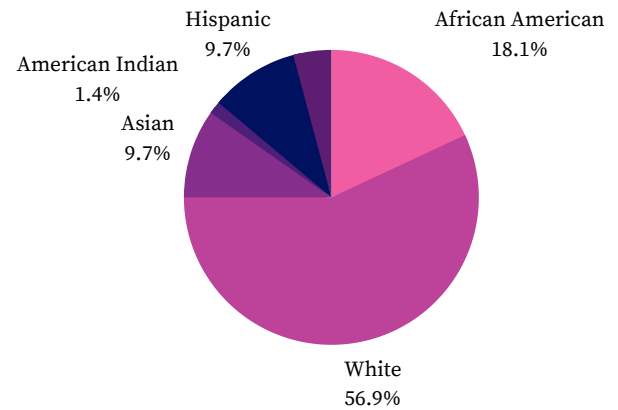

For the Summer of 2021, the State of North Carolina Internship Program has 71 interns serving in 17 state agencies across the state.

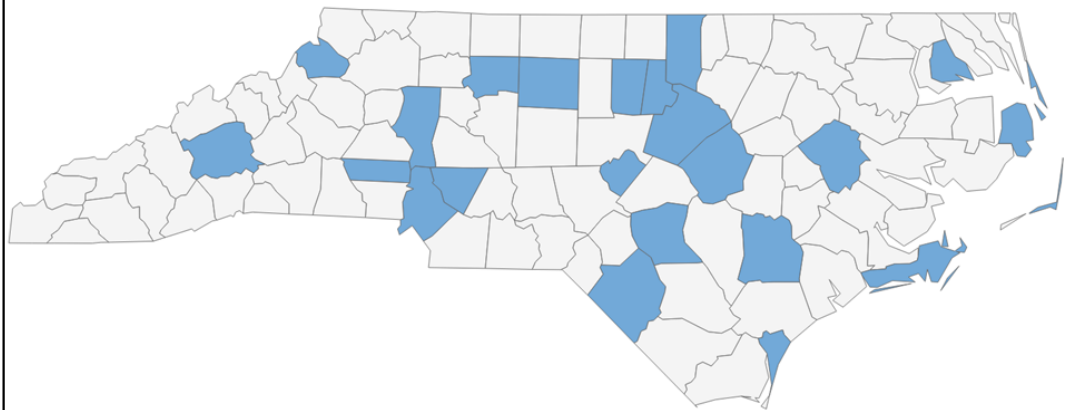
Intern Gender

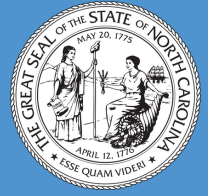

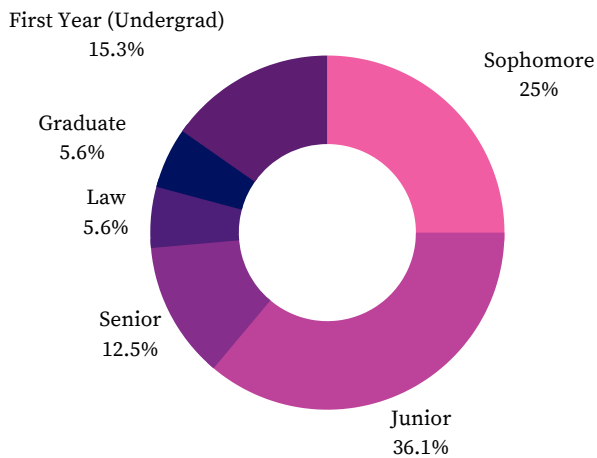

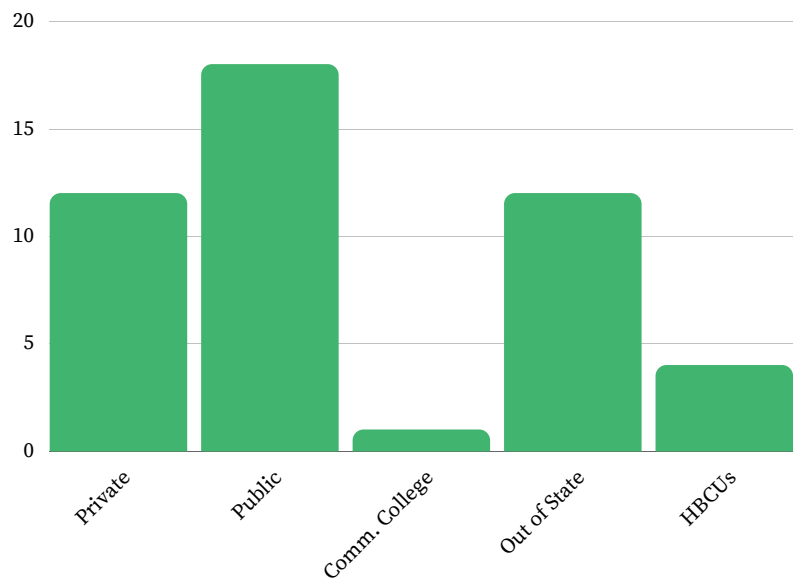
