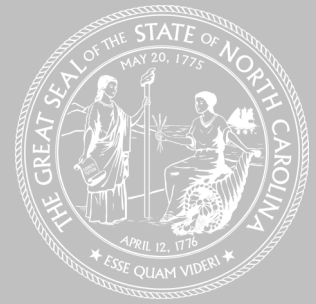


# Emily P. Turner

Leslie J. Winner Public Interest & Civil Rights Fellow at NC Justice Center



Emily P. Turner began her career in public interest, starting in public health and transitioning to immigrant issues. During this time, she gained broad experience in both on-the-ground organizing and nonprofit management, including serving as the executive director of Centro de Enlace, the immigrant community center in her hometown of Burnsville. After 10 years of experience advocating for the marginalized from a grassroots perspective, she headed back to school to take up a new form of advocacy.

Upon graduating from law school, Turner clerked for the Honorable Sri Srinivasan of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit. She is currently the Leslie J. Winner Public Interest & Civil Rights Fellow at the North Carolina Justice Center, where her practice includes civil rights litigation in education, consumer protection, housing, employment, and constitutional law.

Emily is a *summa cum laude* graduate of the University of Pennsylvania School of Law, where she served on the board of the Civil Rights Project and as a senior editor on the University of Pennsylvania Law Review. She is also a *summa cum laude* graduate of Bryn Mawr College with majors in French and mathematics. She resides in Franklin County, where her daughter attends Bunn High.
