North Carolina Council for Women is the state's leading voice on key issues impacting women.

The N. C. Council for Women monitors and ensures accountability for over \$10 million in grants to 293 agencies for shelter and support services to domestic and sexual violence survivors. Last year over 73,000 women and men benefitted from these services. The N. C. Council for Women approves the state's batterer intervention programs.

N. C. Council for Women/Domestic Violence Commission

The N. C. Council for Women 20-member board is appointed by the Governor to address issues including health, education and safety of women in the state.

The Domestic Violence Commission consists of 39 members appointed by the Governor, Speaker of the House and Senate Pro Tempore. The Commission assesses the needs of North Carolina in the area of domestic violence. The Commission members assess, examine and evaluate the causes, prevalence and prevention of domestic violence in North Carolina. Currently the Commission is a partner in the eNOugh domestic violence awareness campaign (<http://www.enoughnc.com/>).
