

Solicitation for State Appropriated Body/Dashboard Cameras 2017-2018 Funding

The Governor's Crime Commission will provide state appropriated matching funds to local and county law enforcement agencies to purchase both body cameras and dashboard cameras. The sum of two million dollars has been allocated by the legislature for this state funded initiative. These funds can also be used for training and related expenses of body/dashboard cameras. The maximum grant amount is \$100,000 and recipient law enforcement agencies shall be required to provide one dollar (\$1) of local/county funds for every one dollar (\$1) of state grant funds; 50/50 match.

Special conditions will be applicable to awarded funds in order to be in compliance with policies and guidelines. Prior to receiving the grant award grantees are required to provide the Governor's Crime Commission appropriate policies and procedures which govern the operation of body-worn/dashboard cameras; and provide appropriate policies and procedures for proper storage of images recorded with those cameras.

Once the agency is awarded a grant the grantee will be required to submit incurred expenses into our GEMS system for reimbursement. Photos of equipment purchased along with a property control form must also be submitted prior to final reimbursement.

Applications will be accepted through our GEMS system starting in November 01, 2017. The application/approval will stay open until funds have been exhausted or the timeframe expired. Timeframe for this grant is on the state fiscal year and will expire 06/30/18. Acceptance for approval will be on a first come first serve basis.
