2 **21 NCAC 32V .0111 PRACTICE DURING A ~~DISASTER STATE OF EMERGENCY~~**

3 (a) ~~In the event of a declared disaster or state of emergency that authorizes the Board to exercise its authority under~~  
4 ~~G.S. 90-12.2, [90-12.5,] and if the board [Board] does exercise its authority pursuant to G.S. 90-12.2, [90-12.5,] the~~  
5 ~~Board may allow a perfusionist licensed in any other state, or a current, active certified clinical perfusionist who~~  
6 ~~practices in a state where licensure is not required, to perform perfusion during a disaster within a county in which a~~  
7 ~~disaster or state of emergency has been declared or counties contiguous to a county in which a disaster or state of~~  
8 ~~emergency has been declared (in accordance with G.S. 166A-6). The perfusionist who enters the State for purposes of~~  
9 ~~this Rule shall notify the Board within three business days of his or her work site and provide proof of identification~~  
10 ~~and current licensure or certification. The Board shall waive the requirements for licensure in the circumstances set~~  
11 ~~forth in G.S. 90-12.5.~~

12 (b) ~~A perfusionist licensed in any other state, or a current, active certified clinical perfusionist who practices in a state~~  
13 ~~where licensure is not required may practice in North Carolina if he or she either: The following individuals may~~  
14 ~~practice under this Rule if he or she either:~~

15 (1) holds a full, unlimited, and unrestricted license to practice perfusion in another U.S. state, territory  
16 or district; or

17 (2) is a [current] current, active certified clinical perfusionist who practices in a state where licensure is  
18 not required who practices perfusion at a North Carolina hospital that is licensed by the North  
19 Carolina Department of Health and Human Services and the hospital meets the following  
20 requirements:

21 (A) verifies [all] the perfusionist's credentials and privileges; and

22 (B) maintains a list of all perfusionists coming to practice and provides this list to the Board within  
23 10 days of each perfusionist practicing at the [licensed North Carolina] hospital. The [licensed  
24 North Carolina] hospital shall also provide the Board a list of when each perfusionist has  
25 stopped practicing perfusion in North Carolina under this Rule within 10 days after each  
26 perfusionist has stopped practicing perfusion under this Rule.

27 (c) A perfusionist may practice under this Rule for the shorter of either:

28 (1) [30] thirty days from the date the perfusionist has started practicing under this Rule; or

29 (2) [a statement by an appropriate authority is made that the emergency or disaster declaration has been  
30 withdrawn or ended and, at such time, the license deemed to be issued shall become inactive.] thirty  
31 days after a statement by an appropriate authority is made that the state of emergency has been  
32 withdrawn or ended.

33 (e)(d) All perfusionists practicing under this Rule shall be authorized to practice perfusion in North Carolina and shall  
34 be deemed to be licensed [to practice perfusion in the State of North Carolina and the] in this State. The Board shall  
35 have jurisdiction over [all] perfusionists practicing under this Rule for all purposes set forth in or related to G.S. 90,  
36 Articles 1 and 40, and such jurisdiction shall continue in effect even after [all perfusionists have] the perfusionist has  
37 stopped practicing [perfusion] under this Rule.
