

MARINE SANDBLASTER – CHIPPER

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

This is journey level work in the preparation of marine craft for painting. Employees remove rust and loose paint, clean metal, and prepare all surfaces for primer. Assignments are received from the Marine Painter Supervisor who inspects the work for satisfactory completion.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES PERFORMED

Sandblasts or sandwashes steel hull, super structure, and voids of ferries, dredges, barges, and workboats.

Operates pneumatic chipper, needle gun, and piston sealer.

Applies primer coat to protect cleaned metal.

Assists in painting trim and decks, and stenciling signs.

Performs related duties as required.

RECRUITMENT STANDARDS

Knowledges, Skills, and Abilities

Working knowledge of techniques used in the preparation of steel surfaces for painting.

Skill in the use of sandblaster, chipper, and scaler.

Ability to follow oral and written instructions.

Physical stamina to operate equipment for considerable periods of time; and work aloft, using bosun's chair when required.

Minimum Training and Experience Requirements - Graduation from High School and three years of related experience or an equivalent combination of training and experience.
