DESCRIPTION OF WORK

This is journey level work in laying brick, stone, and blocks in the construction, maintenance, and repair of buildings and other structures.

Work assignments are received from a supervisor, and employees are expected to perform work independently and in accordance with accepted trade practices. Blueprints often accompany large or unusual type assignments. Work is reviewed by a superior through inspection of work in progress and is further evaluated by personnel receiving service on the basis of appearance of completed repair or construction.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES PERFORMED

Performs general masonry work such as repairing walls, walks, and partitions and in laying out and performing finished work.

Discusses various projects with other tradesmen in carrying out tasks involving other crafts.

Supervises and participates in the mixing of mortar.

Lays cinder blocks, brick or concrete blocks and stones in constructing walls, partitions, manholes, walks, room additions, and similar structures.

Performs related duties as required.

RECRUITMENT STANDARDS

Knowledges, Skills, and Abilities

Considerable knowledge of the standard practices, materials, and processes of the bricklaying trade.

Working knowledge of planning and layout problems involved in small buildings or renovating projects.

Skill in the use of tools and materials of the trade.

Ability to work from rough sketches and blueprints.

Ability to plan and supervise the work of helpers.

Minimum Education and Experience

High school or General Educational Development diploma and one year of experience in the construction or repair of brick, stone or block buildings or walls; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
