

Painter Supervisor

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Employee in this class acts as working foreman in the supervision of painters engaged in the painting of buildings, fixtures, and equipment.

Assignments are received orally or in the form of written job orders, and the employee is required to plan, assign, and inspect the work of other painters working under his supervision. Work is reviewed by a supervisor through inspection of completed work for quality and compliance with work orders.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES PERFORMED

Assigns work to subordinate painters and inspects work completed or in process for quality of workmanship.

Supervises and participates in mixing and applying paints and matching colors.

Inspects surfaces for cleanliness and determines when surfaces are ready for painting.

Makes estimates on the amount of material and labor necessary for a particular job and submits cost estimates.

Supervises the care of brushes, excess paints, oils, and other material used in the trade.

Performs related duties as required.

RECRUITMENT STANDARDS

Knowledges, Skills, and Abilities

Considerable knowledge of the standard practices, materials, and methods of the painting trade.

Working knowledge of methods and materials to be used in preparing surfaces for finishing and of the proper methods of mixing materials to obtain desired colors and qualities.

Ability to plan, assign, and direct the work of journeyman painters and helpers.

Skill in mixing paints and in matching and blending colors.

Minimum Education and Experience

High school or General Educational Development diploma and one year of journey level painting experience; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
